



Founded in 1635, Collège Saint-Charles-Garnier is a **prestigious private high school**, home to approximately **850** local students and 20 international students each semester.

Our French High School program offers full French immersion, both in the classroom and with **host families**, fostering an inclusive and welcoming environment. **Students do not need to be fully bilingual**; a minimum A2 level of French is required to participate.

Located in the **heart of the city**, our campus offers a great environment and an ideal location.

The role of the families is to support all the aspects of the students' life in Quebec (the language, needs/health, the city, the weather, social practices, among others). Students are members of the family.

The families are in touch with the school in order to discuss the students development.

We place 1 or 2 international students per family.








The host families live in safe neighborhoods, easily accessible from the school by bus, bike, or by foot.














- Students receive details about their host family before arriving in Quebec.














The international students can also participate to the trips that the Collège organizes each year.

## **UNIFORM**



International students, such as regular students of the College, must wear the uniform (also known as "**The Collection**") and comply with the rules established in this regard. Students have the liberty to mix and match items from the collection.

#### UNIFORM POLICY FOR THE INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Considering that their stay is for a short period, some exceptions are authorized to international students.

**Top of the Uniform:** White or black polos and shirts not from the collection are permitted if worn under the official school sweater.

**Bottom of the Uniform:** Beige pants and skirts must be from the school collection. Black pants not in the collection may be worn if they meet certain specifications.

**Shoes:** Tennis shoes are only allowed for Physical Education class. Regular shoes must be black, leather or suede, with a black or gray sole.

**Physical Education Uniform:** Students are provided with shorts and a t-shirt for sports class, which should be worn exclusively during those sessions.

- Some days international students migh have French class during lunch time or from 3:30pm to 5pm.

# Do I have to be bilingual to participate to the program?

 No, we ask for a A2 level minimum. Students do a placement test online to see if they have the minimum of French required.

# How do I get to the school everyday?

 Most of the students get to school by public bus or walking.

# What do I do during the weekends and free time?

 Students spend time and do activities with their host family; but they also spend time with their friends as they do at their homeplace.
