Founded in 1635, Collège Saint-Charles-Garnier is a **prestigious private high school**, home to approximately **850** local students and 20 international students each semester.

Our French High School program offers full French immersion, both in the classroom and out of it with **host families**, fostering an inclusive and welcoming household. **Students do not need to be fully bilingual**; a minimum A2 level of French is required to participate.

Located in the **heart of the city**, our campus offers a great setting and an ideal location to live in.

Living with a French speaking host family offers a true immersion experience, as the authentic French environment extends beyond the classroom, making everyday moments an opportunity to live and engage in French.

We have a various range of profiles: families with young children or teenagers, young couples, retired couples, single-parent households, and more.

Regardless of their different compositions, all our host families share a commitment to the values of our program and adhere to our policies.

Students are welcomed as full members of the family. The role of the host family is to support every aspects of the students' new life in Quebec-from the language learning and culture adaptation to health needs, seasonal clothing, and everyday social practices.

Host families maintain regular contact with the school to help ensure the student's well-being and personal growth.

Each household hosts 1 or 2 International students per year, creating a personalized and enriching experience for everyone involved.





The host families live in safe neighbourhoods, easily accessible from the school by bus, bike, or by foot.

How do we choose host families?





- We manage the matching process ourselves, without involving agencies.
- We interview the families, visit their homes, and verify criminal records and references.
- We organize a family meeting at the beginning of each semester.
- Personal profiles of students are matched directly with host families' profiles.
- Students receive details about their host family before arriving in Quebec.
- Regular follow-ups are conducted by the host family coordinator with both the student and host parents.



Meals and snacks are provided by the host family



- Breakfast is eaten at home with the family.
- Lunch is brought from home. It can also be bought at the schools' cafeteria.
- Dinner is enjoyed at home with the host family.
- Families will take into consideration allergies, intolerances, and special diets such as gluten free, lactose, vegetarian, etc.



UNIFORM



International students, like all College students, must wear the official uniform (known as "*The Collection*") and comply with the related dress code policies established. They may combine different pieces from the collection to reflect their individual fashion preferences.

UNIFORM POLICY FOR THE INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Considering that their stay is for a short period, some exceptions are authorized to international students.

Top of the Uniform: White or black polos and shirts not from the collection are permitted if worn under the official school sweater.

Bottom of the Uniform: Beige pants and skirts must be from the school collection. Black pants not in the collection may be worn if they meet certain specifications.

Shoes: Tennis shoes are only allowed for Physical Education class. Regular shoes must be black, leather or suede, with a black or gray sole.

Physical Education Uniform: Students are provided with shorts and a t-shirt for sports class, which should be worn exclusively during those sessions.

School schedule

- Regular classes start at 8:30am and finish at 3:32pm
- Some days, International students might have French classes during lunch time or after school, from 3:45pm to 5pm.

Do I have to be bilingual to participate to the program?

 No, we ask for a A2 level minimum. Students do a placement test online to see if they have the minimum of French required.

How do I get to the school everyday?

 Most of the students get to school by public bus or walking.

What do I do during the weekends and free time?

• Students spend time and do activities with their host family; but they also spend time with their friends as they do at their homeplace.
